Zoning Cases in West Meadowbrook

Two cases in the neighborhood moved through Zoning and City Council in March. A triplex at 3701 Meadowbrook that was zoned A.75 was approved as an A.75 Planned Development duplex with a detached third dwelling. The property will revert to single family if it is sold. Three elderly women placed by the Salvation Army live in the triplex. The owner has committed to participating in the FWPD's crime-free multi-housing program. Also, on March 22, City Council unanimously approved on the recommendation of Zoning to rezone 3629 Meadowbrook Drive from commercial to single family. There was no opposition.

District 11 Candidate Forum

Five candidates running for the City Council seat in this newly formed district have agreed to participate. To vote in citywide elections that choose elected officals who will decide so many issues important to neighborhoods, be sure you are registered and cast your ballot. Early voting, mail-in voting (for those who are eligible), and in-person voting on May 6 are all options to fit anyone's schedule. Any registered voter can vote in any polling location in Tarrant County, an added convenience.
