What do you think about short term rentals in your neighborhood?

City Council has launched a web page with five options for dealing with short term rentals in Fort Worth. Option 1 is the status quo, no short-term rentals of any type in residential neighborhoods. Three options are various methods for authorizing short term rentals in single family area plus "other." You may offer comments on "other." The survey form continues be adjusted in real time, so the information requested may be different when you visit. Please share the link with friends and neighbors. The City is in the process of hiring firms to verify how many short-term rentals, legal and illegal, are operating in Fort Worth and to register and tax those entities. Under the current city ordinance, short term rentals (rentals to guests for under 30 days) cannot operate in single family neighborhoods, but are allowed in many commercial, multifamily and multi-use areas.
