District 11 Runoff Set for June 10

In the first City Council race in newly drawn District 11 on May 6, Rick Herring and Jeanette Martinez moved to a runoff with less than 50 percent of the vote. The City of Fort Worth now has 10 City Council members with two new districts, District 10 in far north Fort Worth and District 11 in the south and east. Five candidates vied for the D11 council seat. Watch for information on early voting and polling locations. Each candidate will be offered an opportunity to produce a 30-second video for the WMNA Facebook page.
