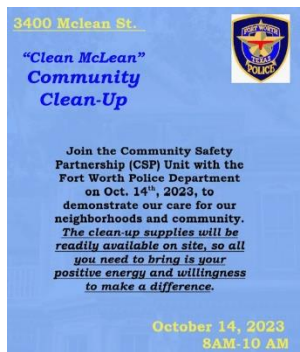
National Night Out was lights out
